KIWANIS EDUCATION

Kiwanian Officially, a Kiwanian is a member of a Kiwanis club and an individual of a good character who adheres to the standards of good conduct in a community and believes in and subscribes to the Objects of Kiwanis International. The individual believes in giving primacy to the human and spiritual, rather than the material values of life; believes in treating other human beings as the individual would like to be treated in all human relationships; believes in promoting the adoption and application of higher social, business, and professional standards; desires to develop, by precept and example, a more intelligent, aggressive and serviceable citizenship; believes in creating and maintaining that sound public opinion and high idealism that makes possible the increase of righteousness, justice, patriotism, and goodwill; and the individual desires to provide, throughout the club, a practical means to form enduring

friendships, to render altruistic service, and to build a better community.

Make-up While a club has regular attendance requirements, a member whose schedule forces him or her to miss regularly scheduled meetings can remain "in good standing" by participating in such things as inter-clubs, attending meetings of other clubs, attending board meetings and round tables.

Round Table A meeting held at a different time and/or place for the benefit of club members who are not able to attend a meeting that has had its time and location temporarily altered. Often Round Table meetings are held on a day other than a scheduled holiday to provide the same attendance opportunity.
